In 1868, Tom Morris Junior became the youngest ever winner of The Open, aged just 17 years and 156 days. The next year he had the first ever hole-in-one in the Championship, at the eighth hole in the first round, and went on to win by 11 strokes. Tommy's name is the first name engraved on the Claret Jug and his gold winner's medal from 1872 is on display in the Museum.

The first women in the world to form a golf club were the St Andrews Putting Club in 1867. They will celebrate their 150th anniversary with a special exhibition in the museum galleries in 2017.
